Also I would like to thank Will Byland for coming forward to take the secretary role, after Claire Daintith had to resign due to family commitments. Minutes of the meeting will be emailed to members, published on the Development Trust website and a copy in the polytunnel, after they have been passed at the next allotment meeting in February 2012.

Site completion jobs

The rabbit fencing is due to be completed asap. The drainage job should also be done this month. External fencing has been started at the north end of the polytunnel, to be completed this month. General weeding and strimming of the site was discussed at the meeting, hopefully members will spare an hour to help with these jobs. I got the strimmer out last weekend and had a go along the path and around the polytunnel. Local Community Payback folk have made a start on the tree maintenance.

Turbine Productivity Report (from our trading subsidiary REWIRED Limited)

We are still on target to reach an average annual productivity of at least 37% on which our financial model is based.

Broadband Next Generation Access

We are working on this project along with Shapinsay and Westray Development Trusts, working together on a feasibility study which will look at improving the broadband speeds across our islands. We have engaged a consultant to provide detailed information regarding options and costs and have met with Orkney Islands Council, who are keen to work with us to improve access for all residents. This is a long-term project, which we will keep you all informed about.

Rousay Heritage Trust

The Development Trust has agreed to a request from the Rousay Heritage Trust to take over the Heritage Trust's administration. The Heritage Trust is, however, to remain a separate entity, since it might be eligible for various alternative sources of funding.

Several of the original Heritage Trust trustees have resigned so applications are invited from any members of the Rousay, Egilsay and Wyre community who are interested in becoming trustees. Meetings of the Heritage Trust are unlikely to be very frequent; a meeting will be called whenever anything arises which falls naturally under its remit and there will need to be a short Annual General Meeting.

- **Potentilla** (Kathryn Dyke) Deciduous, 4 plants only. Split each in half and plant 30 to 50cm apart to make a hedge. £8 for 4.
- **Escallonia** (Apple Blossom) Evergreen. 15 plants available. For a hedge, plant each 25 to 45cm apart. Salt tolerant. £2 each.
- **Olearia** (macrodonata) Evergreen. 48 plants available – sufficient for a hedge 21 metres in length. Salt tolerant. £2 each.
- **Olearia** (semidentata) Evergreen. 20 plants available. £2 each.

Hebe

- Hebe (armstrouffii) Evergreen. White flowers.
 - Hebe (carnea) Evergreen. 1.2m high. Plentiful production of rose-pink flowers which fade to white.
 - Hebe (franciscana) Evergreen. Resistant to salt-laden winds. Produces dense racemes of blue flowers.
- All Hebe are suitable for hedges. Plants cost £2 each, and £1 for smaller.

- **Cotoneaster**. Evergreen. Prostrate and mat forming with ground-hugging stems that root where they touch the soil. Ideal for carpeting banks and unsightly ground. 3 plants available. £2 each.
- **Tuniferus horigontalis**. Evergreen. Prostrate with sharp, pointed blue-green needles. 5 plants available. £2 each.
